

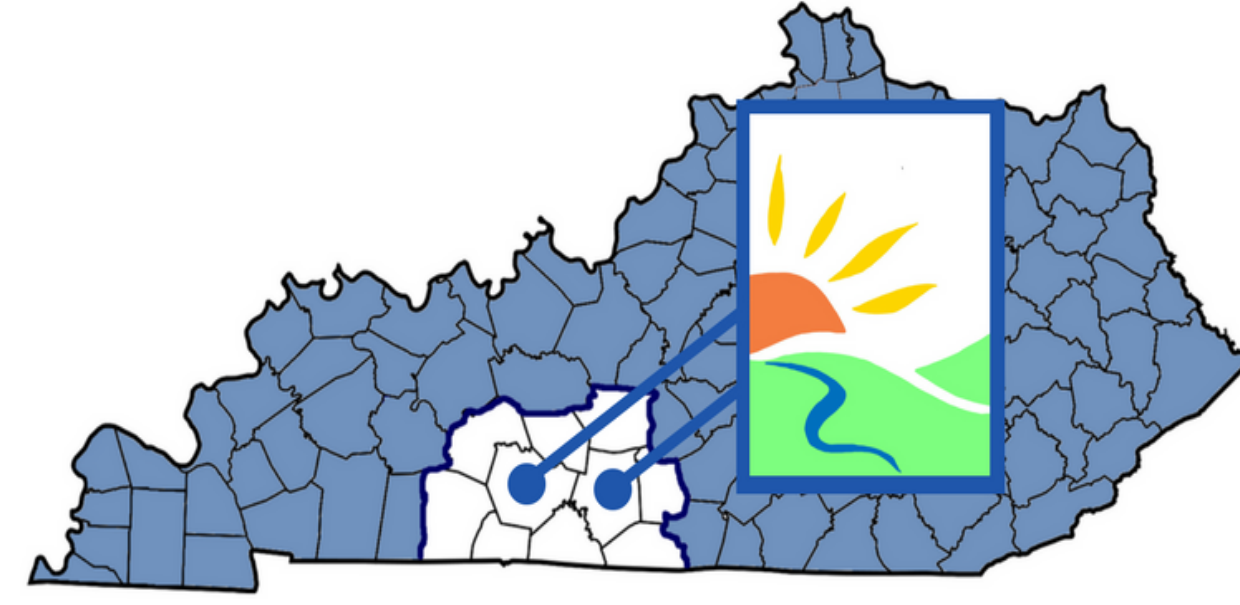

unique clients

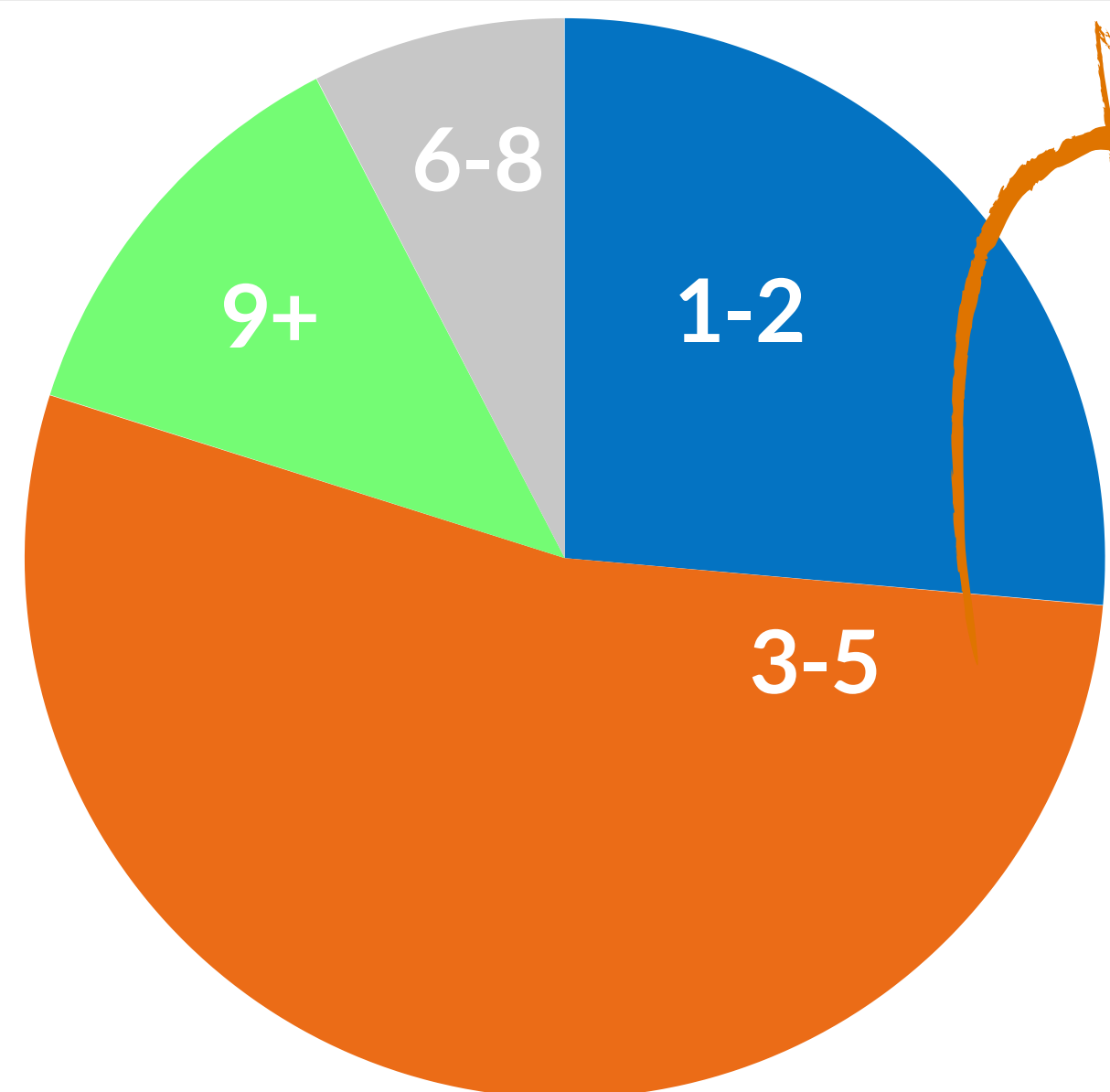

51.2%

of clients say they use drugs 3-5 times a day

24% of clients say they use drugs 1-2 times a day

15% of clients say they use drugs 9+ times a day

9% of clients say they use drugs 6-8 times a day

16.5%

of clients have been screened for HIV at an initial or return SEP visit

33.9%

of clients have reported being positive for Hepatitis C

77.5%

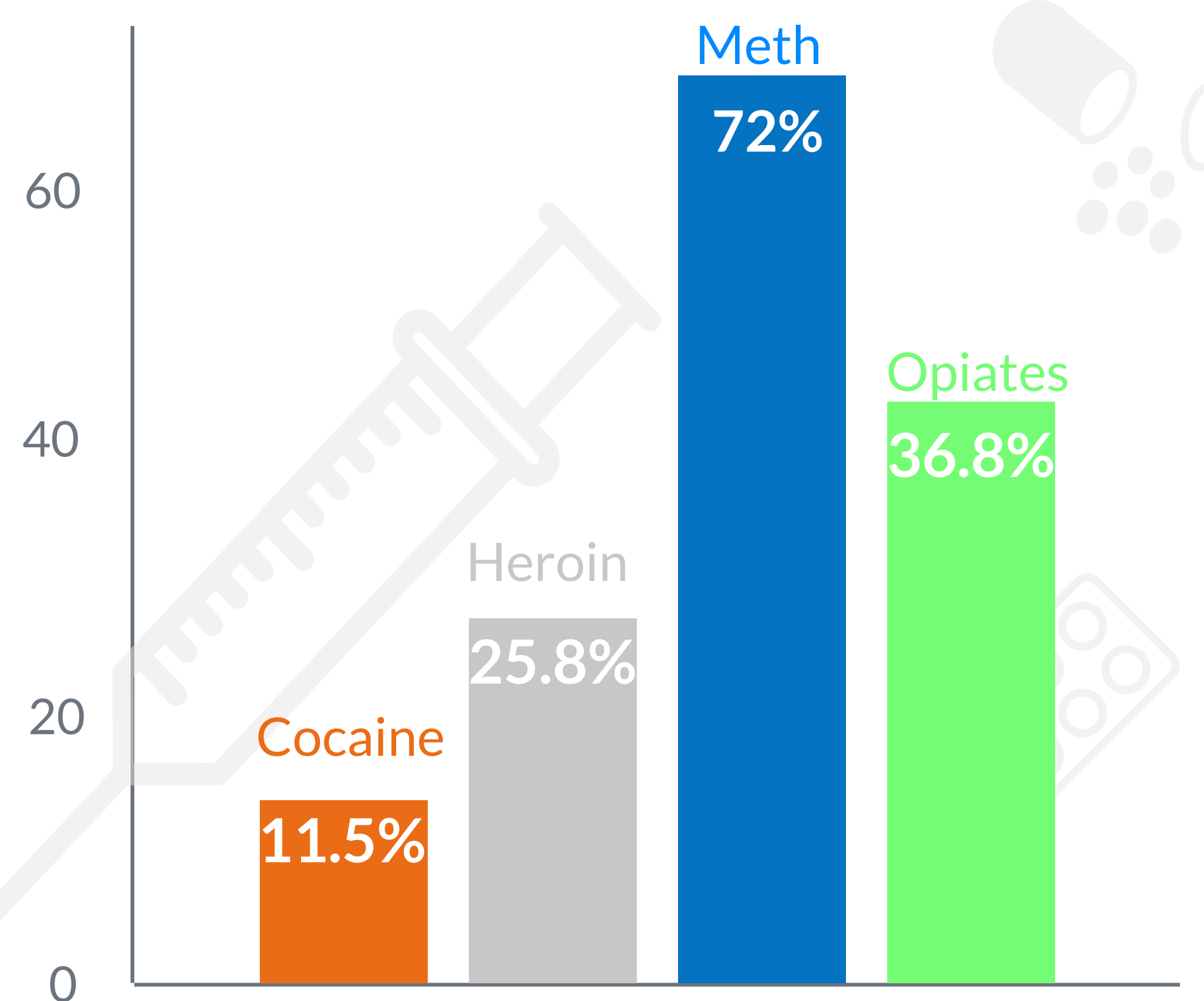
of clients admit to sharing needles and other supplies at their initial visit

35.9%

of clients said that they have overdosed when asked at initial visit

67.7%

of clients said that they have been in recovery at some point



72%

of our clients say their drug of choice is methamphetamine

36.8%

of our clients say their drug of choice is opiates
